Lipman Backpack Event

It's Back-to-School season at the elections office!

Earlier this month, the Elections Team attended the 13th Annual Lipman Backpack Giveaway event. Since 2010, Lipman Family Farms has donated school supplies to students in their home base of Immokalee. This event ensures that children and their families are prepared and have everything they need to tackle the new school year.

This year, the event had over 60 exhibitors and gave away over 1,500 backpacks filled with school supplies, over \$15,000 in gift cards, 2,700 pairs of sandals, approximately 600 pairs of shoes, 300 bicycles and food.

ELECTION WORKER ORIENTATIONS

The Collier County Supervisor of Elections office is known across the state and across the nation for conducting smooth, transparent and accurate elections. We led the state in 2020 with 90% of our voters turning out among a national health crisis, followed by a flawless election in 2022 immediately after one of the worst hurricanes to hit SWFL.

Our success would not be possible without the help from our dedicated Elections Team and volunteers who strive to serve their community.

In preparation for the 2024 elections, we are seeking civic-minded individuals to work at the polls or work temporarily in our office during each election. Interested individuals should go to www.CollierVotes.gov/HELP where they can learn more about the positions available and fill out an application. Applicants will then be invited to attend an election worker orientation.

BACK -2- SCHOOL

The new school year has begun, and we are ready to kick off two of our school programs: the High School Voter Registration Challenge and Art for Democracy contest.

Celebrating its 10th anniversary, the High School Voter Registration Challenge is a competition between local high schools to see which school can reach the highest number of voter registrations and pre-registrations by the end of the challenge. The program includes a presentation on the importance of voting, as well as a step-by-step walk-through of the voter registration form. The winning school will receive recognition and a plaque from Supervisor of Elections, Melissa R. Blazier. Students 16 and older can participate in the challenge which will take place September 13 through October 13.


Art for Democracy is an annual art contest and students grades K-12 can submit original artwork with voting and election-centric themes. Students K-8 may

also enter an original design for an "I Voted" sticker to be considered for use in the 2024 elections. Winning students and schools receive recognition at an artists' reception and a monetary prize is awarded to the winning high school student, as well as the school's art department for the piece that wins Best in Show. The call for entries opens Monday, October 2.
