#### Be Election Ready

We are less than 100 days away from the first election of 2024: the Presidential Preference Primary (PPP). Election Day for the PPP is Tuesday, March 19, 2024, and there are a few things you should know before then.

Typically, the PPP is part of the presidential nominating process for Florida's two major political parties. However, since the Democratic Party has only one candidate, the Republican Party will be the only participating party in the upcoming election. Here are a few reminders to help you BE Election Ready...

- Florida is a Closed Primary state. Voters must register to vote and/or update their party affiliation by February 20 in order to participate in this election.
- Voters who wish to vote by mail for this election must submit their Vote-by-Mail ballot request by 5 p.m. on March 7. All Vote-by-Mail ballot requests from previous years have expired.
- Early voting is March 9-16 and polls are open 10 a.m.-6 p.m. daily.
- Election Day is March 19 and polls are open 7 a.m.-7 p.m. Voters must vote in their assigned polling place.
